



Meeting with Ministry of Labour





"Leveraging European Partnership for Competitive Thailand" Seminar on "Developing your business with IPRs"

On 16 November 2012, The European ASEAN Business Centre (EABC) joined hands with the Department of Intellectual Property (DIP) to boost business value of Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs) for competitive Thailand. Striving towards the improvement of trade and investment climate in Thailand and awareness raising on the importance of IPRs for business success among European and Thai SMEs, the EABC and the DIP coorganised the Seminar entitled "Developing your business with IPRs" at Sofitel Sukhumvit, Bangkok. The event went successfully with over 100 participants joined the event.

With the main objective to raise awareness and public understanding on the importance of IPRs, guest speakers from both public and private sectors gave useful information and shared several interesting case studies which the audience could apply to their businesses.

The seminar started with welcome speech from Mr Rolf-Dieter Daniel, EABC President. Then Mrs Pajchima Tanasanti, Director General of the Department of Intellectual Property, and Mr Pekka Pentilla, Trade and Economic Attaché of the Delegation of the European Union to Thailand were honorably gave opening speech highlighting importance of IPRs for the Thaileconomy. Mr Stephane Passeri, Chairperson of the







EABC Working Group on IPR stated in its introductory remarks the importance for companies as well as public authorities to develop a long-lasting strategic approach of Intellectual Property Rights creation, management and protection.

The topic of discussion during the morning session was 'Current Development of IP in Thai Economy'. In this session, Mrs Pajchima Tanasanti, Director General from the Department of Intellectual Property, gave an Introduction on National IP Plan. After that, valuable presentation on SME development: branding and marketing strategy was shared by Dr Masato Abe from UNESCAP. Participants also learned from real testimonials on successful implementation of IPR in business from Dr Chanakan Sriratanaban, Nokia Siemens Networks.

There were two panel discussion sessions in the afternoon in order to showcase the IPRs practices and enforcement of organizations and companies in Thailand.

The first session was on IPR enforcement: Challenges & Success for the public and private sectors was moderated by Mr Nandana Indananda, Partner Tilleke & Gibbins, former Judge at CIPITC and joined by: Police Colonel Chainarong Charoenchainao, Deputy Commander, Economic Crime Suppression Division, Royal Thai Police; Mr Komtharnongchai Chaipharirojn, Presiding Judge, the Central Intellectual Property and International Trade Court;

Press Conference to Announce The First Annual Business Confidence Survey

On the 19 December 2012, The European ASEAN Business Centre (EABC) organized a press briefing to announce the result of the first annual business confidence survey. The results sohwed that overall outlook of the respondents is optimistic. The business environment in Thailand and AEC offers significant opportunities. The majority of respondents plan to expand their business in ASEAN and Thailand.

However, this is related to a call for improvement in important areas such as trust in public institutions and political instability, human resource issues, corruption and lack of transparency, and poor logistical infrastructure.

The event strated with the presentation on the result of the Busienss Conidence Survey by Mr Rolf-Dieter Daniel, President of EABC who highlighted that the survey feedback received from 221 respondents provided a very interesting and valuable perspective on current challenges and upcoming opportunities for business operating in Thailand and afar in the international scene. Majority of the survey participants were top level and senior executives of companies of different sizes operating in various industries.

The results serve as an important insight for EABC to continue our tasks by working with key institutions and counterparts towards strategizing their policies

"Half of the respondents evaluated the performance of the Thai government and authorities as neutral. Interestingly, however, a much higher peoperation of the remaining half regarded the govern-ment and authorities' performance negatively, particularly regarding policies and the regulatory environment, enforcement and implementation," he said.

To attract new investors, Mr Duniel said Thailand needs to ensure leves and regulations are in line with the AEC seas to guarantee five and fair competition. Malaysia is much more open, while Singapore has a free-trade agreement with Europe and Vietnam has entered negotiations for a similar FEA.
